


Education Contest:

Each year, CDA sponsors education contests for Catholic and non-Catholic youth to use their talents and express their beliefs through poetry, essay, music, art, computer art, or photography. Two topics are presented for the youth to choose from. Monetary awards are distributed at the local, state, and national level. Age categories include grades 4-5, 6-8, and 9-12. Adult CDA members may participate in the poetry, art, computer art and music adult divisions.



Scholarships to Catholic Colleges

State Abuse Project:

Our SD project began in 2000. The goal is to raise funds to assist victims of abuse in the Abuse Shelters across South Dakota. Each Court receives bags of Lifesavers for their Abuse Awareness Fundraiser. Monies raised are divided on a 50-50 ratio between the State and the local courts. Local courts can use the donations within their own communities. March is Abuse Awareness month.



Military Project:

Through the State Military Project, our donations are used to provide items or materials needed to SD men and women who are currently serving or to our Veterans in South Dakota.

Priest Appreciation Day:

1981 marked the beginning of this special day when CDA Courts host receptions on the first Sunday of June, for our Priests and religious, as a thank you for their spiritual guidance.



Bishops Burse ~ Sioux Falls and Rapid City Dioceses:

Financial donations are given at the Biennial State Conventions to the Bishops. These are applied towards the education of seminarians and the continuing education of the Priests within their Diocese.

Legislation Operation Morning Star is the network to involve Courts in pertinent legislation that address the needs and moral issues which impact the quality of life and family values. Our goal is to inform our members to contact their Congressional leaders through email, phone, and letters, urging them to support legislation that upholds our Catholic teachings.



Circle of Love: This National program gives the Catholic Daughters effective ways to serve their communities and missions. To be effective in promoting good works, we must reach out and make a difference in the lives of those who are suffering or those who need our love, support and prayers. Each point of the circle, **Quality of Life, Youth, Education, Legislation, Spiritual Enhancement, Leadership, and Family** are the areas that we focus on to make a difference; locally or nationally.

The House of Mary Shrine is located approx. five miles west of Yankton on Lewis and Clark Lake. The Marian Shrine is set in a natural setting inviting all to retreat and worship. The Holy Spirit hermitage was funded by the SD Catholic Daughters in 1984. The shrine includes Holy Stairs, Living Waters, Stations of the Cross, waterfall, rosary pond, gardens, and the Holy Innocents Memorial dedicated to the unborn. A stained glass window with the image of the Blessed Virgin Mary was donated by Catholic Daughters in 2000 and graces the original building on the site. This is a SD project.



CDA National Charities

North American College, Smile Train, Catholic Relief Services, Covenant House, Disaster Relief, Mother Teresa, Tutwiler Clinic, National Shrine of the Immaculate Conception, Apostleship of the Sea, Catholic Extension

North American College in Rome Just as young men and women are called to the religious life, Catholic Daughters are called to the respond by supporting vocations. Support comes from gifts of prayer, encouragement, and funding for the Seminarians at North American College in Rome for the men and with the 'Laboure' Society for the ladies.

Smile Train is one of the newer CDA projects. ALL money (100%) donated goes to the surgical repair of cleft palates and lips that these young children are born with. It only takes \$250 to change a life—save a life with this comprehensive surgery, with speech therapy, general dentistry and orthodontics. Without this surgery children aren't allowed to go to school, cannot eat or speak. They are isolated and shamed. They are simply too poor for this simple surgery, but we as a membership can help repair and change their lives.



Catholic Relief Services CDA Supports this International project started in 1943 to assist people in the poorest parts of the World, reaching out to more than 100 countries with food, medical supplies and religious assistance.

Covenant House Founded in 1972 in New York City, Covenant Homes across the US provide 24-hour emergency shelter, food, clothing, medical attention, short and long-term counseling, and a safe place to survive for homeless and runaway youth. Financial support by CDA courts assists with this mission.

Disaster Relief The Catholic Daughters maintain a Disaster Fund to which our members contribute. At the request of the State Regent where a disaster occurs, monetary assistance is forwarded to the Bishop of that Diocese for distribution. Donations have gone to FL, LA, MS, and TX; and relief was sent to Mexico, MN, AR, WV, NH, NY, OH and TX experiencing major flooding. In 2017, South Dakota was given funds for draught relief.

CDA National Charities and Projects

Mother Teresa In 1950, Mother Teresa received permission to start her order, "The Missionaries of Charity", whose task was to love and care for those persons nobody was prepared to look after. In 1965 the Society became an International Religious Family by a decree of Pope Paul VI.



Tutwiler Clinic CDA's National Charity adopted in 2000. This clinic is located in Tutwiler, MS. Founded in 1981, by Sr. Anne Brooks, MD. Sister and sixteen religious sisters from eleven different communities, run the clinic. CDA financial support enables these angels of mercy to provide medical care for the most needy people of this Delta area. The clinic receives many requests to provide medical supplies, household items and more.



Basilica of the National Shrine of the Immaculate Conception Located in Washington DC. The Shrine is the largest Catholic church in the US and in North America and the tallest habitable building in Washington DC. Its construction began in 1920 and the *Trinity Dome* mosaic marked its completion on 12-08-17.



Apostleship of the Sea Since 1920, Port Ministry has provided spiritual, physical and psychological services to seamen and religious at port locations in the US. CDA supports these men and women with personal items, especially during the Christmas Season.

Catholic Extension



Catholic Extension was founded in 1905 in remote areas lacking church buildings and resources. Their vision is to raise money to help bring the Catholic Church to these isolated communities. Today, they serve 87 'mission dioceses', funds approximately 2000 projects annually throughout the USA and its Territories.

CDA National Projects

SOAR, National Center on Sexual Exploitation Holy Cross Family Rosary, Habitat for Humanity, and Laboure Society

SOAR Founded in 1986 with \$25,000 seed money from CDA, SOAR (Support Our Aging Religious) is a nonprofit organization committed to assure financial stability and to personally secure the futures of elderly and frail members of Catholic religious congregations.



National Center on Sexual Exploitation Beginning in 1990, SD Courts have supported NCOSE through our state wide **White Ribbon Against Pornography (WRAP)** campaign. CDA members

display and distribute white ribbons as a symbol of our determination to end pornography in the media. Hardcore pornography, leads to sexual violence, sexually transmitted diseases, family breakup, and unwed pregnancy. CDA cooperates with NCOSE efforts proposing legislation, and testifying before legislative and administrative committees to end pornography in the marketplace and society.

Holy Cross Family Rosary The rosary is an important part of CDA prayer life and for our families. Fr. Peyton, Holy Cross ministries, encourages the rosary to share the message of prayer and to strengthen our prayer life. CDA supports various radio rosary prayer times.



Habitat For Humanity Since becoming involved with Habitat, in 1995, CDA members have raised money to help build over 40 homes in the USA & Mexico. This worthwhile project provides not only affordable basic housing, but improves the lives of the families who have this new place called home.

Laboure Society The Laboure Society encourages and financially supports women who wish to enter a religious community. Over 65% of those supported would not be able to do so without the assistance. Our CDA donations help make this possible. St. Catherine Laboure is their patroness.
